This multi-service Office highlights the decision of the Ministry to move in a different direction to establish social services that work hand in hand to help, empower and transform the lives of our poor and vulnerable clients. The collaboration of these Divisions is necessary to expand and improve this Ministry's customer service delivery and to enhance convenience and access to the public. Their money and time will be better utilized coming to this one stop shop.

This is just one of the many Offices that we will be opening. The Ministry will be opening an additional centre in Arima, for fiscal 2025. The Resolution for dividing the Local Public Assistance District of St George East, which is located in Tunapuna was approved on Thursday 22nd August, 2024 by the Central Public Assistance Board. The Resolution also states that the Local Public Assistance Board of Arima will be established and the Local Public Assistance Board of St. George East will now be called the Local Public Assistance Board of Tunapuna. Most of our clients who live in the Borough of Arima and environs will now be required to go to the Local Public Assistance Board in Arima. More details will be shared about this in the near future. These changes will positively impact our clients and our staff. We continue to look for Buildings that can adequately and comfortably accommodate or staff in Aranguez, and Point Fortin, Couva and Sangre Grande. These are the Local Public Assistance Boards that will be our focus for fiscal 2025.

Creating comfortable work spaces for our staff is of upmost importance. The Executive and I want you to know that we care about the quality of your physical work environment. We believe that providing a comfortable workspace can positively influence employee morale and productivity. We also look forward to hearing good testimonials from our clients who experienced positive, professional and customer focused services from you all.
