"I don't have no secret, it is all the Heavenly Father" says Mrs Roach before she and Minister Cox gave a hearty rendition of "One day at a time sweet Jesus."

Minister Cox also indicated that the recognition of seniors falls under the Division of Ageing's soon to be relaunched Salutation to Centenarians Programme where persons who have attained the age of 100 and older are recognized and honoured for their contributions and how they positively influence the evolution of our society.
