On March 17, 2024, celebrations were held in honour of two exceptional women who attained the milestone age of one hundred (100) years. They are Ms Ivy Arthur and Ms Rita Harewood.

Ivy Arthur has no secret to longevity

Born March 16, 1924, the celebrations for Ms Ivy Arthur took place at her residence in San Juan. When questioned about her secret to her longevity, the centenarian heartily replied "I have no secret." However, relatives noted her penchant for prayer, hymn singing, and a diet predominantly comprising fish may have contributed to her longevity.

Ms Arthur was born in Venture, Barbados. Her industrious and independent nature led her to migrate to Trinidad and Tobago seeking employment. Nonetheless, relatives teasingly suggested that her move to Trinidad and Tobago was driven by a quest for a boyfriend. In her response, Ms Arthur said "I have one boyfriend. Christ Jesus."

Rita Harewood credits God as her secret to longevity

The celebration honouring Ms. Rita Harewood's significant milestone was held at the Belmont Community Center on her birthdate, March 17th. "Granny" or "Ms Otty" as she is known to many, credited "God" as her secret to longevity. 


